## Lotsa Dots! by Kimberly Einmo

KIMBERLY

In this class you'll learn fun, new techniques for decorative machine applique and you'll be able to experience the ease and accuracy of the Accuquilt GO! cutter. If you choose to make your quilt larger after class, simply select 1 Layer Cake (or 40-10" squares) plus  $2\frac{1}{4}$  yards background fabric.

## **Supply List for Class:**

- EZ Jelly Roll Ruler by Kimberly Einmo (I will have them for sale in class at a discount.)
- Fabric as listed in the chart below
- 45 mm (or larger) rotary cutter with a sharp new blade
- Rotary mat
- 50-wt. cotton thread in a neutral shade for piecing (I recommend Aurifil)
- At least 2 spools of 50-wt. cotton thread in a contrasting color for machine appliqué
- 1 yard lightweight fusible web (I recommend Soft Fuse Premium™.)
- 1 yard lightweight tearaway (temporary) stabilizer (Sulky® Tear Easy™ Stabilizer works well.)
- Basic sewing supplies such as scissors, straight pins, seam ripper, etc.
- The class kit will include a twin needle.

## **Fabrics**

Prints or batiks are recommended for the circles and block setting squares. Make it easy on yourself and buy a Layer Cake and yardage for your background fabric!

FABRIC	YARDAGE	CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS
For the background	¾ yard light value fabric	<ul> <li>1 - 8½" square</li> <li>4 - 4½" squares</li> <li>1 - 12½" square; cut twice diagonally to yield 4 side setting triangles</li> <li>2 - 6½" squares; each cut once diagonally to yield 4 corner setting triangles</li> </ul>
For the large circles	• 1 – 5½" square backed with fusible web	
For the medium circles	<ul> <li>4 – 3½" squares backed with fusible web</li> </ul>	The circles and block
For the small circles	4 – 2½" squares backed with fusible web	squares will be cut in class using the AcccQuilt GO!
For the block border squares	12 – 2½" x 10½"     rectangles, ONE from     EACH of 12 different     fabrics	cutter.
