 1 Jelly Roll or 40 – 2½" strips AND 1 Layer Cake or 40 – 10" squares (Use precut bundles or fabric from your stash. Bundles should be of matching or at least from a complimentary fabric line.) 	Approximately 5 yards total	 To make this quilt, please have a variety of at least 20 different fabrics for a total of 40 – 2½" strips and 40 – 10" squares total. (Fabrics can be repeated twice. 40 or more different fabrics make the quilt even more amazing!) Bring all fabric to the workshop
Background Fabric Yardage	5 yards	 Choose a tone on tone or solid that has strong contrast from the other fabrics Bring all fabric to the workshop
Contrasting Fabric	1¼ yards	For inner border and binding
Backing	4¼ yds	2 panels 36" x 76" (Not needed for class)

- 45 mm (or 60mm) rotary cutter
- 18 mm rotary cutter (for grooved tools)
- Rotary mat 24" or larger is best
- Olfa rotating 12" x 12" (or 17" x 17") rotary cutting mat (optional, but very helpful)
- Ruler: 6" x 24" or 4" x 18"
- 10½" (or larger) square ruler with 45 degree line
- 20½" square ruler (optional, but very helpful)
- 50 wt. cotton (Aurifil) neutral sewing thread to match your background fabric
- Extra machine needles sharps, quilting, microtex in a variety of sizes from 75, 80, and 90
- · Roll of tear-away (temporary) stabilizer
- 1 yard of Soft Fuse fusible web (or other lightweight fusible)
- Selection of 40wt. or 50 wt. contrasting threads for decorative stitching and machine appliqué
- Invisible thread
- Extra bobbins
- Basic Sewing Supplies such as sewing scissors, straight pins, general sewing supplies, seam ripper Items on general supply list (as provided)
- Bring anything you might need to make your retreat experience more efficient, stress-free, and enjoyable! (Think: a portable light, extension cord, a cushion to sit on, magnifying or reading glasses, something to drink in a cup with a spill proof lid, chocolate... and most importantly, a sense of fun!)
