It takes 18 – 10" squares, plus some fabric for the background and tree trunks to make this perfectly pieced pine tree quilt! With Kimberly's *Precision Flying Geese & HST Ruler* and her *Precision Jelly Roll or Precision Precuts Ruler*, you'll create these pretty blocks with ease.

Supply List

- *Precision Flying Geese & HST Ruler* (required) by Kimberly Einmo
- *Precision Precuts Ruler* (recommended) or *Precision Jelly Roll Ruler*
- 45mm or 60mm Rotary cutter
- Cutting mat, larger than 12" square
- 50 wt. cotton sewing thread in a neutral color
- Basic sewing supplies

Fabric Requirements and Instructions

Cutting and construction methods are written specifically for the Precision Flying Geese & HST Ruler (PFGH) method. Specialty rulers will be available for sale in the classroom prior to the start of class.



FABRIC	YARDS	CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS
#1 - Background fabric	3¼ yards	<p>Cut the highlighted pieces (all colors) and bring to class:</p> <p>Cut the following LOF (length of fabric) from the background fabric and set aside for borders:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cut 2 - 3½" x 64½" strips for the side outer borders. • Cut 2 - 3½" x 52½" strips for the side top and bottom borders. • Cut 2 - 2" x 49½" strips for the side inner borders. • Cut 2 - 2" x 38½" strips inner top and bottom borders. <p>Use the remaining fabric to cut the pieces below:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cut 8 - 4½" x 6" rectangles. • Cut 2 - 4½" x 6½" rectangles. • Cut 8 - 7" x 6½" rectangles. • Cut 4 - 7½" x 7" rectangles. • Cut 13 - 3½" x 7½" rectangles. • Cut 18 - 4½" x 10½" rectangles. For MIRROR image elongated triangles, cut 9 RIGHT SIDE UP rectangles in half diagonally and 9 RIGHT SIDE DOWN rectangles in half diagonally (36 triangles total). • Cut 12 - 2¼" x 14½" rectangles. • Cut 2 - 3¼" strips (used to make strip pieced units for trunks large trees). • Cut 2 - 2" strips (used to make strip pieced units for trunks small trees). • Cut 2 - 2" strips; use Side B of the PFGH Ruler to Cut 18 PAIRS of triangles. • Cut 3 - 2½" strips; use Side B of the PFGH Ruler to cut 36 PAIRS of triangles. • Cut 1 - 2" strip; cut 36 - 1" x 2" rectangles.
#2 - Large pines and small border trees	A variety of fabrics	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 18 - 10" x 10" squares for pine tree blocks.
#3 - Tree trunks	1/8 yard	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cut 1 - 2" strip. • Cut 1 - 1½" strip.
#4 - Binding	½ yard	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cut 6 - 2¼" strips.
